St Saviour's & St Olave's Old Girls' Association was founded in December 1906 by Miss Frodsham, the first Headmistress. It was originally set up to offer support to ex-pupils after they had left school. In the early years the OGA also offered various extra-curricular activities, such as sports and drama clubs, for both pupils and OGA members. Over the years the OGA has gradually evolved to become the social group that it is today. We do still support the school in a variety of ways as can be seen from an assortment of gifts and plaques around the building.

Membership is open to all ex-pupils of St. Saviour's and currently member's ages range from 20 to 90+. Membership is free for the first year of leaving school, and thereafter is just £5.00 per year. All staff, while they are working at St. Saviour's, automatically have free membership of the OGA and when they leave are invited to become paying members. If they retire from the school, they automatically become honorary life members.

We meet each year at school, normally on the last Saturday in September. This gathering is for our Annual General Meeting, at which the President gives her report on the events of the previous school year. The Hon. Sec./Treasurer and the Membership Sec. each also give a short report on their respective areas of the OGA. It is also when we have our annual lunch, for which members pay. The AGM offers a chance for ex-pupils and ex-staff to meet up and exchange news with each other, and to find out what's going on at school and what plans the school has for the future. The current Head Girl and a few Prefects help us with lunch and give guided tours of the school so that Old Girls can see what has changed since they were last at St. Saviour's. A selection of school memorabilia are available to buy at the meeting, along with copies of old school magazines and Newsletters. There are also information boards about some of our more illustrious ex-pupils, news of member's activities and school achievements past and present.

Each year the OGA publishes a magazine exclusively for members. The magazine, which is available at the AGM, features photos, news, and articles about and by Old Girls, as well as the odd quiz or crossword, and almost anything else we can think of.
