### .and take on the Aircraft Challenge!

During Activities Week the Smallpeice Trust provided a STEM day for 60 Year 9s to participate in. The STEM day was called the Aircraft Challenge and involved the students working in teams of 6. In their teams the students first had a competition to see which team could build the tallest tower that could hold 100g that was made from only 10 pieces of paper, nothing else was allowed. This led to competition so fierce that a team who had a confirmed working tower height of 64cm (which would go on to win) promptly destroyed their tower so no other teams could copy their design.

But the main point of the day was for students to design and build their own balsa wood plane, first choosing their materials and justifying costs, then cutting the wood into the correct shape, arranging and sticking the pieces together and then constructing own motor circuit to power the plane. At the same time, they had to make a A3 poster presentation on their design for their plane. These multiple ac-


tivities really helped the teams work together and organise themselves in an effective manner. Finally, once the students had made their plane they could launch them in the school playground. The students' pride in their work cannot be under estimated as when each plane was launched and the plane guided down the playground, each team celebrated as if they had just scored the winning goal in the world cup.

Students enjoyed working as a team to produce an aeroplane, including learning to use equipment like a hot glue gun. Students said they enjoyed finding out how useful physics is and putting theory into practice.
